Geography, History, Religious Studies and Citizenship are key elements of the British culture and values aspect of the course, all of which will support our Pre A level course students in understanding life in Britain.

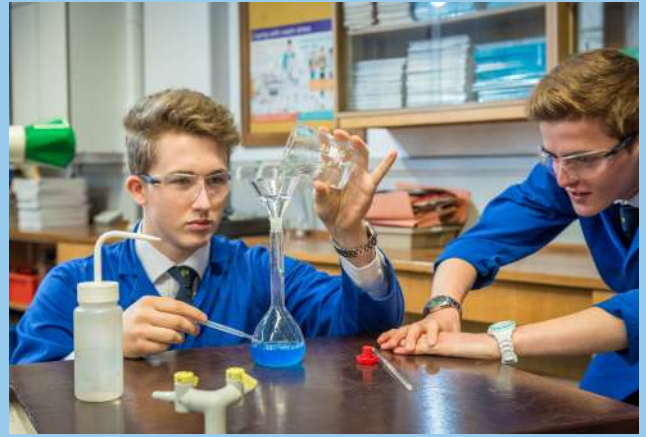
